Liturgy of the Word

First Reading
A Reading from the Book of Malachi.
(Malachi 3:1-3,5,8,16-17,19-20 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Book of Malachi.

"I am sending My messenger, who will prepare the way before Me. Then, the One you seek will come suddenly to the temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, is coming," says the God of the universe. "But who can endure the day of this coming? Who can stand when God appears? God will be a refiner's fire and fuller's soap, refining the Levites, the priests, like silver and gold.

I, your God, will draw near to you for judgment. I will be swift to bear witness against evildoers and those whowithout fear - deprive a laborer of wages, oppress a widow or an orphan, or turn aside a resident alien. You ask, "Can a mere human rob God? Yes! You are robbing me!" "But", you say, "How are we robbing You?" "You are robbing Me of tithes and offerings. You store them up in your storehouses!"

Those who honored God consulted with each other. God listened. They wrote names on a scroll of remembrance, written in God's presence. "On that day," says God, "they shall be mine! As a mother treasures her child, I will treasure these. As a father has compassion for his beloved, I will have compassion for these. As a parent loves, so I will love these.

"A day of reckoning will come; but for all who bear my Name, the sun of justice will rise with healing in its wings. And you will go out leaping like calves from a stall."

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

Lector: Justice will endure.

Lector: Do not fear those who perpetuate evil. Do not envy those who do wrong. Do not be provoked by them. They will soon fade like the grass, an d wither like the green herb. Better the meagerness of the just than the plenty of the wicked. Delight in God who will give you your heart's desire.

People Respond: Justice will endure.

Lector: Those who use violence unsheathe their swords and string their bows to fell those who are poor and oppressed, to slaughter those who seek justice. Their sword shall pierce their own heart. Their bows shall be broken.

Lector: A reading from Saint Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians.


We were not idle when we were with you. You know you ought to follow that example. We did not eat anyone's food without paying for it. We worked night and day, laboring and toiling so that we would not be a burden to any of you. Even though we had the right to assistance, we did this because we wanted to provide an example of diligence, hoping it would prove contagious.

Do you remember when we were with you? We often repeated the saying: "Anyone unwilling to work should not

eat." Yet now we hear that some among you are idle and disruptive. They are not busy; they are busybodies. Such people we ask and encourage in the name of Jesus to do their work quietly and earn their keep. And as for you, beloved, do not grow weary of doing what is good.

As Jesus was saying this, some people were remarking how the temple was adorned with beautiful stones and with great gifts dedicated to God. Wearily, Jesus said, "As for what you see here, the time will come when not one stone will be left on another. Every one of them will be thrown down."

"Teacher," they asked, "when will these things happen? What will be the sign that they are about to take place?" Jesus replied: "Watch out that you are not deceived. Many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am the one,' and 'The time is near!' Do not go after them. When you hear of wars and uprisings, do not be afraid. These things must happen first, but they do not mean the end is near.

Jesus continued: "Nations will rise against nation, kingdoms and empires will rise against each other. There will be great earthquakes, great famines and plagues in various places. Terrifying sights and great signs will come from the sky, from the universe itself."

"But before the end comes, you will be seized and persecuted. You will be handed over to synagogues and put in prison. You will be brought to trial before rulers and governors, and all on account of my name. In these very actions, you will bear testimony to me. So, do not fret in your hearts beforehand how you will defend your-selves. I will give you words and wisdom that none of your adversaries will be able to resist or contradict.

But you will be betrayed even by your parents, by brothers and sisters, all siblings, relatives and friends. They will put some of you to death. You will be hated because of me. But not a hair of your head will be lost. Stand firm, endure, persevere, and you will gain Life."

Lector: We pause to remember names of those who suffer with illness and for those who have asked for our prayers [Lector will pause while names are spoken.] May their faith in God's healing restore them to fullness of life, for this we pray:

Lector: We pause to remember the names of loved ones and friends, especially those we've included in our Book of Remembrance, [Lector will pause while names are spoken.] May perpetual light shine upon them, for this we pray:

our prayer.

Lector: For prayers left unspoken, and for those held deep, within the silence of our hearts, for this we pray:

People Respond: Loving God, hear our prayer.

Celebrant: Good and Gracious God, Show us the path to life and the fullness of joys, and protect us with your grace. May we always serve you faithfully and trust in you to provide for our needs. Grant this through Jesus the Christ, our Savior. Amen.
