## Liturgy of the Word

#### **First Reading**

#### A Reading from the Book of Acts. (Acts 2:14a, 36-41)

Lector: Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed: "Let the whole house of Israel know for certain that God has made both Christ and Redeemer, this Jesus whom you crucified."

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, "What are we to do?"

Peter answered them: "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Christ Jesus so that your sins are forgiven, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is made from long ago to you, to your children, and to all the people God calls, even those living far away."

Peter spoke for a long time about Jesus. He urged everyone: "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation."

Those who accepted his message were baptized; about three thousand people were added that day.

#### Second Reading

#### A Reading from First Letter of Peter. (1 Peter 2:20b-25)

Lector: If you should suffer for doing something good, Know that this is God's grace working in you. God called you to this kind of life, because Christ suffered for you.

He left you an example so you might follow in his footsteps. After all, he "did not sin; he never lied." He did not abuse others when he was abused. He did not threaten others when he suffered. Instead, he offered himself to God, the just Judge. He bore our sins when he died on the cross, so That we could be freed from sin and live with God.

We were cured by the wounds he suffered. Before, you were like sheep who wandered away. Now, you returned to your shepherd and protector.

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Respond: Thanks be to God.

#### Gospel Acclamation (Alleluia)

Celebrant: Alleluia, alleluia.

People Respond: Alleluia, alleluia.

Celebrant: Jesus said: I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and they know me.

People Respond: Alleluia, alleluia.

### Gospel

A Reading from the Gospel according to John. (John 10:1-10)

Celebrant: Our God is with you.

People Respond: And also, with you.

Celebrant: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John.

People Resp<mark>ond: † Praise to you,</mark> Jesus the Ch<mark>rist.</mark>

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; th<mark>ey will run away from</mark> him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.
