Saint Martin of Tours Inclusive Catholic Community is the first independent Catholic faith community in Franklin County, Vermont. St. Martin's is part of a vibrant movement known as the Independent Sacramental Movement that has emerged across the U.S. over the last 30 years. (Independent Catholicism has existed in Europe and South America for many decades).

We are:

- a sacramental community centered around the Eucharist and all Sacraments
- grounded in all we love of the Catholic tradition, the celebrations, and the rhythms of the liturgical year
- a people of prayer and a people of service and social justice
- inclusive, affirming, respectful of diversity, and share the Body and Blood of Christ with all who seek to receive Him reverently

All of this binds sisters and brothers across the Catholic landscape as we expand our Faith. We gather at Mass by worshipping God, our Creator, in community and praising Him in song (which is praying twice!) We meet God through our senses of seeing, hearing, tasting, touching, and feeling. Liturgy of the Word

First Reading
A Reading from the Song of Songs.
(Song of Songs 3:1-4 (CCL))

Lector: The first reading is from Song of Songs.

By night on my bed, In my dreams, I look for whom my soul loves. But when I awaken, there's no one there. I will get up now, and walk about the city; Out through the streets and into the squares, I will seek whom my soul loves.

Ah, but I searched, but found no one. The watchmen on their rounds found me, though; I wanted to ask them, "Have you seen him, the one whom my soul loves?" But no sooner did I pass by them, then I found him at last, whom my soul loves.

I put my arms around him, and would not let go of him, until I had brought him home, into my mother's house, in the very room where she made me.

Responsorial Reading (Spoken) (Psalm 42:2-6, 8-9 (CCL))

Lector: We long to know Your love, O


People Respond: We long to know Your love, O God.

A Reading from the Second Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians. (2 Corinthians 5:14-17 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that He died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

So from now on, we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Respond: Thanks be to God.

People Respond: And also, with you. Celebrant: A reading from the Good News attributed to John.


People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

Now Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot.

They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" "They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. He asked her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?"
