A Reading from the Book of the Acts of the Zephaniah.
(Zephaniah 3:14-18 (CCL))

Don't grow slack, but be fervent in spirit: The One you serve is Christ Jesus. rejoice in hope; be patient under trial; Persevere in prayer.

Look upon the needs of God's holy people as your own; be generous in offering hospitality. Bless your persecutors - yes, bless them and don't curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep.

Have the same attitude toward everyone. Do not be condescending to those who aren't as well of as you; and do not be conceited.
