Lector: Our second reading is from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians.

What I have passed on to you, I received from Christ - that on the night he was betrayed, our Savior Jesus took bread, gave thanks, and broke it into pieces, saying: "Take and eat this. This is my body, which is broken for you. Do this in memory of me." In the same way, Jesus took the cup of wine after dinner, and said: "This cup is the New Covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do it in remembrance of me." For every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim Jesus' death until He returns from heaven.

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

Celebrant chants: Alleluia

Celebrant Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever."

Celebrant: Our God is with you.

People Respond: And also, with you.

Celebrant: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John.

People Respond: † Praise to you, Jesus the Christ.

But when the crowd found out, they followed him. Jesus welcomed the crowd and spoke to them about the reign of God, and healed all who were in need of healing. As sunset approached, the Twelve came and said to Jesus, "Dismiss the crowd, so they can go into the surrounding villages and countryside and find lodging and food, for this is a remote and isolated area."
