## Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

A Reading from the First Book of Kings. (1 Kings 17:8-16 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the First Book of Kings.

The word of God came to Elijah saying: "Go now to Zarephath, and stay there. I have commanded a woman a widow - to feed you." Elijah set out and went to Zarephath, which was in the territory of Sidon, which was a Gentile town.

When Elijah arrived at the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks. He called to her and said: "Bring me a little water in a jar, so that I may drink."

As she was going to called to her and said: "Bring me also a morsel of bread." The she said: "As God, your God lives, I have nothing baked. I have only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug. I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my child. We will eat it, and then we will die."

Elijah said to her: "Do not be afraid. Go, and do as you have said; but first, make me a little cake of it, and bring it to me and afterwards make something for yourself and your child. For the God of Israel says this: 'The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that God sends rain on the earth.'"

The widow went and did as Elijah said. She, her household, and Elijah ate for many days. The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of God spoken through Elijah.

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people. *People Respond: Thanks be to God.*  Responsorial Psalm (Spoken) (Isaiah 42:1,5-6; 49:22-23; (CCL))

Lector: Through my servant, I embrace all people.

Lector: Thus says God, who created the heavens and stretched them out, Who spread out the earth and its produce, Who gives breath to its people and spirit to those who walk on it.

People Respond: Through my servant, I embrace all people.

Lector: Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I am well pleased. Upon this one I have poured out my spirit. This one shall bring forth justice to the nations.

People Respond: Through my servant, I embrace all people.

Lector: I, God, have called you for justice. I have grasped you by the hand. I formed you, and set you as a covenant for the people, a light for the Gentiles.

People Respond: Through my servant, I embrace all people.

Lector: I, God, will lift up my hand to the Gentiles, and to the peoples raise my signal. They shall bring your sons in their arms. Your daughters shall be carried on their shoulders, All your children will rejoice and play together.

People Respond: Through my servant, I embrace all people.



1 Kings 17:14

Lector: Rulers shall guard you, royalty shall be your servant leaders. In homage, they shall honor you and kiss your holy feet. Then you shall know that I am God. None who hope in Me shall be ashamed.

People Respond: Through my servant, I embrace all people.

Second Reading A Reading from the Book of Galatians.

(Galatians 2:1-10 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Galatians.

When I went up to Jerusalem with Barnabas, taking Titus with me, I had not been there for 14 years. I went up to Jerusalem in accord with a revelation. In Jerusalem, I presented the gospel that I've preached to the Gentiles. I did this privately, to those of repute, so that I might not be running, or have run, in vain. Moreover, not even Titus, who was with me, although a Greek, was compelled to be circumcised!

Some agitators were secretly brought in, to spy on the freedom that we have in Christ Jesus, that they might enslave us; but we did not submit to them even for a moment, so that the truth of the gospel might remain intact for you. Those who were reputed to be important - even though, what they once were makes no difference to me because God shows no partiality - made me add nothing to the gospel that I preach. On the contrary, they saw that I had been entrusted with the gospel to the uncircumcised, just as Peter (known as Cephas) had been entrusted to the circumcised.

Christ Jesus, the One who worked in Peter, making him apostle to the circumcised, worked also in me, as apostle to the Gentiles. When they recognized the grace bestowed upon me, James and Peter and John, who were

reputed to be pillars, gave Barnabas and me their right hands in partnership, that we should go to the Gentiles and they to the circumcised. Only, we were to be mindful of the poor in Jerusalem, which is the very thing I was eager to do.

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Respond: Thanks be to God.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark. (Mark 7:24-30 (CCL))

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ be with you all.

**People Respond: And also, with you.** Celebrant: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark.

People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

Jesus set out and went to the region of Tyre, a Gentile territory. He entered a house. He didn't want anyone to know he was there, yet he could not hide. Immediately, a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit heard of him. She came to him and threw herself at his feet. The woman was a Greek, a Gentile, Syro-Phoenician by origin. She begged Jesus to cast the demon out of her daughter.
