First Reading
A Reading from the Book of the Deuteronomy.
(Deuteronomy 6:4-9 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy.

Hear O Israel: The Name that is Holy, our God, is One.

Love your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. Write these words...in your heart. Recite them to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise.

Bind them as a sign on your hand. Fix them as an emblem on your forehead. Write them on the doorposts of your home and on your entryways.

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Respond: Thanks be to God.



#### Responsorial Psalm (Spoken) (Wisdom 3:1-9 & 13-14 (CCL))

Lector: God's grace and compassion rests on the holy ones.

Lector: The souls of the just are in the hand of God. No torment will ever touch them. In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died. Their departure was thought to be a disaster, their leaving us to be their end, but they are at peace.

People Respond: God's grace and compassion rests on the holy ones.

Lector: Although some regard suffering as punishment, their hope is full of immortality. So great will their blessings be, their suffering will seem slight. They were tested and found worthy. Like gold in the furnace, they were proved. Like a whole offering, like a sacrifice, their deaths are holy. They are accepted.

Lector: In the time of their visitation, they will shine forth: they will run like sparks through the stubble; they will govern nations and rule over peoples, like the stars; they will enjoy cosmic glory forever.

**Second Reading** 

A Reading from Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. (1 Corinthians 15:35-42 & 54-55 & 13:12-13 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians.

Some will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" Nonsense! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. As for what you sow, you do not sow the body that is to be, but a bare seed, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain.

It is God who gives it a body, and to each kind of seed its own body. Not all flesh is alike:

There is one flesh for human beings, another for animals, another for birds, and another for fish. There are heavenly bodies and earthly bodies.

The glory of the heavenly is one thing, and that of the earthly is another, even as we all participate in cosmic glory. There is one glory of the sun, and another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars. Indeed, star differs from star in glory.

So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. When this perishable body puts on imperishability, and this mortal body puts on immortality, then the saying that is written will be fulfilled:


"Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"

Now, we are looking in a mirror that gives only a dim reflection. Then, we shall face to face. Now, I know in part. Then, I shall know fully, even as I am fully known. And so, faith, hope, and love endure, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ be with you all.

People Respond: And also, with vou.

Celebrant: A reading from the Good News attributed to Mark and Matthew.

People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

One of the scribes asked Jesus, "Which is the foremost of all the commandments?"

Jesus answered: "The foremost is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Holy Name, our God, is one. Love your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength', and the second is this, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."



When the Chosen One comes in honor, with all the angels alongside, and takes up the seat of judgment, all nations and peoples will gather around. Then, the Chosen One will sit as judge and separate people, one from another, as a shepherd separates sheep from goats. The sheep will be placed on one side, the goats to the other.

Those spoken to first will ask: "But when did we see you hungry and give you food, or see you thirsty and give you drink? When did we welcome you as a stranger, or see you naked and give you clothing? When was it that you were sick, and we helped you? When did we visit you in prison?"

And the Chosen One will say in reply: "In truth I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of my beloved siblings, you did to me, and those last spoken to will go away, suffering eternal consequences, but the just will enter into the fullness of Life, a Life unending."

Celebrant: The Gospel of Jesus the Christ.

People Respond: Praise to you, Jesus the Christ.
