✠ We pause to remember names of those who suffer with illness and those who have asked for our prayers [Lector, pause and count to 6]. We ask that God’s healing touch restore them to fullness of life; for this we pray:

✠ We pause to remember names of deceased loved ones and friends who have died [Lector, pause and count to 6]. We ask that God meet all face to face who have gone on to Greater Life, and that they may be forever held in His loving arms; for this, we pray:

People Respond: Loving God, hear our prayer.

✠ For prayers left unspoken, but held deep, within the silence of our hearts. For this, we pray:

People Respond: Loving God, hear our prayer.

Celebrant: Good and generous God, hear our prayers for those in need. We offer our gratitude for your healing grace, and your gifts, freely given. Help us to remember all that you do for us, and make us generous in our view of others, whose faith we may not recognize. We ask this through Jesus the Christ. Amen.

All: Amen.
