The sisters of Lazarus sent word to Jesus, saying: "Master, the one you love is ill."

When Jesus heard this he said: "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

Now Jesus loved Martha, and her sister, and Lazarus. So when he heard that Lazarus was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was.

Then, after this, he said to his disciples: "Let us go back to Judea."

When Jesus arrived, he found that Laz-

arus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; while Mary sat at home.

He became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said: "Where have you laid him?"

They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said: "See how he loved him."

But some of them said: "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"

So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said: "Take away the stone."

Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him: "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days."

Jesus said to her: "Did I not tell you that, if you believe, you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone.

And Jesus raised his eyes and said: "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me."

And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice: "Lazarus, come out!"

And the dead man came out, with his hand and feet tied with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth.

So Jesus said to them: "Untie him and let him go."

Now many who had come to Mary and had seen what he had done began to believe in him.

Announcements — Looking Ahead

Holy Week Happenings - Week of April 2nd to 9th

- Palm Sunday, April 2nd, 10:30 a.m. Passion of Our Lord Blessing & Distribution of Palms. This Mass recalls Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on his way to his passion and death. The Palm Sunday celebration marks the beginning of Holy Week.
- Holy Thursday, April 6th, 7:00 p.m. Mass of the Last Supper. This Mass recalls Jesus' institution of the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders (priesthood) and when He gave us his greatest Commandment to love one another. The altar is stripped at the end of this Mass and remains bare until Easter.
- Good Friday, April 7th, 7:00 p.m. Prayer Service, Holy Communion. On Good Friday, there is no consecration of the Eucharist, but Holy Communion follows the Liturgy of the Word and Veneration of the Cross.
- Holy Saturday, April 8th, Postponed until 2024 Easter Vigil. Holy Saturday separates
 Good Friday from Easter Sunday and is the day we celebrate the vigil of Christ's followers
 held for Him outside of the tomb as we await the Resurrection. Vigil traditions include lighting the fire and blessing water and candles to symbolize Christ's passing from death to life.
 We toll the bells at the Gloria, signifying the joyous end of Lent.
- Easter Sunday, April 9th, Sunday Mass, 10:30 a.m. Celebration of the Resurrection of Christ!
