Liturgy of the Word

First Reading
A Reading from the Book of Genesis.
(Genesis 15:5-12,17-18 (USCCB))

Lector: A reading from the Book of Genesis.

Yahweh took Abram outside and said: "Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can! As many as that, you will have for descendants."

Abram believed Yahweh, and Yahweh accounted it to Abram as righteousness." Yahweh then said to Abram: "I am Yahweh who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans to give you this land as a possession." Abram asked: "O God, most holy, how am I to know that I will possess it?"

God answered Abram: "Bring me a heifer, a goat, and a ram, each three years old, and a turtledove, plus a young pigeon."

Abram brought all of these, cut them in half, and placed each half opposite the Other - except for the birds, which he did not cut up. Birds of prey swooped down on the carcasses, but Abram drove them away. As the sun was about to set, a trance fell over Abram, and a deep, terrifying darkness enveloped him.

When the sun had set and it was dark, a smoking brazier and a flaming torch appeared, which passed between the halves and the sacrifices. On the day, Yahweh made this covenant with Abram: "To your descendants I give this land, from the River of Egypt to the Great River, the Euphrates."

ses and Elijah appeared in glory and spoke with Jesus about the exodus was going to be accomplished in Jerusalem.


