Have you already forgotten the words of encouragement God told you as his children? "My children, when our God corrects you, don't treat it lightly; and don't get discouraged when God reprimands you. For every child God loves, He also corrects. He disciplines every child He calls his own."

Stand tough as you are corrected, just the way God deals with you as His children. Is there any child who has not been disciplined by a parent? At the time it is administered, any discipline seems a cause for grief rather than joy. But later on, everyone who was corrected bears fruit in peace and justice for those formed by it.

So, hold up your drooping hands and steady your trembling knees! Walk a straight path, so that your failing limbs will not get worse, but will be healed.
