Saint Martin of Tours is the first independent Catholic faith community in Franklin County, Vermont. St. Martin's is part of a vibrant movement known as the Independent Sacramental Movement that has emerged across the U.S. over the last 30 years. (Independent Catholicism has existed in Europe and South America for many decades).

First Reading
A Reading from the Book of Isaiah.
(Isaiah 61:1-3, 10-11 (CCL))

The Spirit of the Exalted One is upon me, because God has anointed me to proclaim good news to those who are poor. God has sent me to mend broken hearts; to proclaim freedom for captives; and release for prisoners; to proclaim the year of God's favor, and the day of God's vindication.

The Spirit of God has anointed me to comfort all who mourn; and provide for those who grieve in the Holy Land; to bestow upon them a crown of beauty instead of ashes; the oil of joy instead of mourning; a cloak of praise instead of despair.

A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through

him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. And this is the testimony of John. When the Jewish people of Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?"

John admitted, and did not deny it - he said, "I am not the Christ."

So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No."

So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?"

John said: "I am the voice of the one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord,'" as Isaiah the prophet said."

Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?"

John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie."

This happened in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.
