If you use biting words against each other and tear up each other's reputation, be careful! You may end up destroying the whole community.

And so, I tell you this. Walk with God's Spirit in your life. Don't give in to selfishness and self-indulgence. Since the flesh is at odds with the Spirit, and the Spirit with the flesh, that you cannot do every little thing you want to. Remember. If you are led by God's Spirit, you are free from the Law.
