Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

A Reading from the Book of Acts. (Acts 1:3-5, 12-15 (CCL))

Lector: Jesus presented himself alive to the disciples by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them over forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God.

While meeting with them, Jesus urged them not to leave Jerusalem but to wait for "the promise of God, about which you have heard me speak. John baptized with water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

The disciples returned to Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives, near Jerusalem, a Sabbath's day journey away. When they entered the city, they went to the upper room where they were staying. Peter and John, James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James, son of Alphaeus, Simon, the Zealot, and Jude, son of James, were there.

With one heart, all of them joined constantly in prayer, with some of the women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, and Jesus' siblings. Altogether, there was a group of about 120 persons gathered in that one place.

(1 John 5:1-6 (USCCB))

Lector: Beloved:

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves God, also loves the one begotten by him.

In this way, we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

Christ Jesus is the one who came through water and blood, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one that testifies, and the Spirit is truth.

A Reading from the Gospel according to John.
(John 20:1, 11-18 (CCL))

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ be with you all.

People Resp<mark>ond: And also, with you.</mark>

Celebrant: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John.

People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

Early in the morning, on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary of Magdala went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance.

Mary stood, crying, outside the tomb. While weeping, she stooped down and saw two angels inside. They were dressed in white and were sitting, one at the head and one at the feet of where Jesus' body had laid.

The angels asked Mary: "Why are you weeping?" She answered: "They have taken away my Teacher, and I don't know where they've put him."

Jesus then told her: "Do not hold on to me! I have not yet gone to the Beloved. But tell my other disciples that I am going to my Beloved and your Beloved, to my God and your God."

Mary Magdalene then went to the disciples with the message: "I have seen the Teacher!" And she told them what he had said to her.

People Respond: Praise to you, Jesus the Christ.
