Welcome to Saint Martin's!

Saint Martin of Tours is the first independent Catholic faith community in Franklin County, Vermont. St. Martin's is part of a vibrant movement known as the Independent Sacramental Movement that has emerged across the U.S. over the last 30 years. (Independent Catholicism has existed in Europe and South America for many decades).

We are:

- a sacramental community centered around the Eucharist and all Sacraments
- grounded in all we love of the Catholic tradition, the celebrations, and the rhythms of the liturgical year
- a people of prayer and a people of service and social justice
- inclusive, affirming, respectful of diversity, and share the Body and Blood of Christ with all who seek to receive Him reverently

All of this binds sisters and brothers across the Catholic landscape as we expand our Faith. We gather at Mass by worshipping God, our Creator, in community and praising Him in song (which is praying twice!) We meet God through our senses of seeing, hearing, tasting, touching, and feeling. All are a part of what strengthens us in our Faith and reminds us of what it means to be Catholic.

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading A Reading from the Book of Judith. (Judith 8:2-17)

Judith's husband died when she was still young. She maintained her bereavement for three years and four months. She built a small tent on the roof of her house and lived there, wearing sackcloth.

Judith was very beautiful and wealthy. She ran her entire estate. No one ever spoke a harsh word about her because she was devout. Judith heard the cries of the people of the land. They were weak, for lack of water and could no longer defend their village against attackers.

She heard what their leader, Uzziah, had said to them, how he promised them under oath to surrender the town to the attackers after five days, if God did not deliver them. She invited village leaders to her home.

She said to them: "Listen to me. You are supposed to be the leaders of the people here; but what you said to the people today was wrong. You should never have sworn before God that you would surrender the village to our enemies if God did not come to our aid in five days. What gives you the right to put God to the test? You can never fathom the depths of the human heart or know what anyone is thinking. Yet you dare to read God's mind and interpret divine matters?!

God cannot be threatened like a human being or won over by pleading like a mere mortal. So, while we wait for deliverance, we must continue to call upon God to help us. Whatever happens, our voices are heard, and we are in God's hands."

Uzziah then spoke: "This is not the first time you have shown your wisdom. Ever since you were born, people have recognized that you pos-

sess keen understanding and integrity. But the people are so thirsty. Pray for us that God will send rain to fill our wells. Then we will no longer be weak from thirst."

Judith replied: "What I will do tonight will be told for generations to come. God will deliver Israel through me."

People Respond: † Praise to you, Jesus the Christ.

After the Sabbath, very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb. She saw the stone was rolled away from the entrance to the tomb. Mary ran to Simon Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them: "The Rabbi has been taken from the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him!"

Mary stood just outside of the tomb, weeping. Even as she wept, she stooped to peer inside the tomb. There, she saw two angels in dazzling white robes. One was seated at the head and the other at the foot of the place where the body of Jesus had been laid.

Both asked her: "Why are you weep-ing?"

She answered them: "Because they have taken away my Rabbi, and I don't know where they've laid Him."
