Lector: Our first reading is from the Book of Deuteronomy.

God will delight if you obey his voice and keep his commandments and his statutes, which are written in this Book of the Law, and if you turn to Yahweh, your God, with all your heart and with all your soul.

For this commandment that I give to you today, it is not too difficult for you, nor is beyond your reach. It is not up in heaven, so that you need to ask yourselves, "Who will go up to heaven for us, and bring it down to us so that we may hear it and keep it?" Neither is it beyond the seas, that you should say, "Who will cross the seas for us, and bring it back to us so that we may hear it and keep it?" No, the word of God is very near to you; it is in your mouth, and in your heart, that you may keep it.

For in Christ were created all things in heaven and on earth, everything visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through Christ and for Christ. Before anything was created, Christ existed before all things, and all things hold together in Christ.

Christ is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, and so Christ is first in every way. God wanted all perfection to be found in Christ, and all things to be reconciled to God through Christ, everything in heaven and everything on earth, making peace by Christ's blood on the cross.
