Saint Martin of Tours Inclusive Catholic Community is the first independent Catholic faith community in Franklin County, Vermont. St. Martin's is part of a vibrant movement known as the Independent Sacramental Movement that has emerged across the U.S. over the last 30 years. (Independent Catholicism has existed in Europe and South America for many decades).

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading A Reading from the Book of Ezekiel. (Ezekiel 2:1-5; 3:7, 11-15 (CCL))

Reader: A reading from the Prophet Ezekiel.

The Voice said to me: "Human One, Rise up! I will speak with you." When the Voice spoke to me, the Spirit entered me and Set me on my feet. As the Voice spoke to me, I listened:

"Human One, I'm sending you to the Israelites, a nation of rebels who have protested against me. They and their ancestors have been in revolt against me to this very day. Their descendants are bold of face and stubborn of heart. To them, I am sending you, and you shall say to them: 'Thus says your God...'

Whether they hear or refuse to hear (for they are rebellious) at least they will know a prophet has been among them. "The house of Israel will refuse to listen to you, since they refuse to listen to Me. The whole house of Israel is stubborn of brow and stubborn of heart.

"Now, go to the exiles, to your own people, and speak to them. Whether they hear or refuse to hear, say to them: 'Thus says your God!'"

The Spirit then lifted me up. Behind me I heard a loud, rumbling noise as the glory of God, like a chariot, rose from its place. I heard the noise of the wings of the living creatures beating against one another, and the noise of wheels alongside them, a loud rumbling.

The Spirit swept me up and carried me away. And I went off, angry and bitter in spirit, for the hand of God pressed hard upon me. Thus, I came to the exiles who lived at Tel-abib by the river, Chebar, and there they dwelt. There, I stayed among them,

distraught for seven days. Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

A Reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Galatians.
(Galatians 1:1-2; 10-12 (CCL))

A reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Galatians.

Paul, an apostle - sent neither by human commission nor from human authorities, but through Jesus the Christ and our Loving God, who raised Jesus from the dead - and all the members of God's family who are with me,

To the churches of Galatia: Am I now currying favor with human beings or God? Or am I seeking to please the people? If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a servant of Christ. Now I want you to know, beloved, that the gospel preached by me is not of human origin. I did not receive it from a human being, nor was I taught it. The gospel I preach came through a revelation of Jesus the Christ.

Then they turned against Jesus. Jesus said to them: "Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown, and among their own kin, and in their own house."


Jesus was not able to do many powerful deeds there, Except for laying hands on a few sick people, healing them. Jesus was astounded at their lack of faith.
