# First Reading A Reading from the Book of Joshua.

Joshua, son of Nun, secretly sent out two spies saying, "Go and scout out the land, especially Jericho."

When the two reached Jericho, they entered the house of an inn-keeper, a prostitute, whose name was Rahab. They spent the night there. Jericho's ruler was told, "Some Israelites have come here tonight to search out the land."

The ruler of Jericho sent officials to Rahab with this order for her: "Bring out the visitors who have entered your house, for they have come to spy out the whole land." But the woman had taken the two spies and hid them.

Rahab said to the officials, "True, those you speak of came to me, but I did not know from where they came. When it was time to close the gate at dark, they went out. Where they went, I do not know. Pursue them quickly, for you can overtake them."

She had, however, brought them up to her roof and hid them with the stalks of flax she had laid out there. The officials went in pursuit of the spies, in the direction of the fords of Jordan. As soon as they had gone out, night fell, and the gate was shut.

The Israelites had not yet settled down to sleep when Rahab came up to them on the roof and said, "Now then, since I have dealt with you kindly, vow to me - by your God - that you, in turn, will deal kindly with my family. Give me an unmistakable sign of good faith that you will spare my mother and father, my sisters and brothers, their children, and all who belong to them,

and that you will deliver us from death." The two answered: "We pledge our lives for yours."


