
We are:

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading
A Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy.
(Deuteronomy 18:15-20 (CCL))

Moses said to the people, "The Holy One, your God, will raise up for you a prophet like me from among the people, one to whom you will listen.

"This is what you requested of the Holy One, your God, at Horeb. On the day of the Assembly you said, 'If we hear the voice of the Holy One, our God, anymore, or ever again see this great fire, we will die.'

Then God said to me, 'What they have said is well said. And so, I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their own people. I will put my words in the mouth of the prophet, who will tell them everything my heart desires. Anyone who does not heed the words that the prophet speaks in my Name, I myself will hold accountable. But the prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, or presumes to speak in my Name a word that I have not spoken... that prophet will perish.'

"You may say to yourself: 'How can we know if it is a word that God has not spoken?' If a prophet speaks in the Name of God, but the thing does not take place or prove true, it is a word that God has not spoken. The prophet has spoken it presumptuously. It will not come to pass."
