## Liturgy of the Word

#### First Reading

A Reading from the Second Book of Kings:

One day Elisha [EE-lye-shah] came to Shunem [Shoe-nehm], where there was a woman of influence, who urged Elisha to dine with her. Thereafter, whenever Elisha passed by the area, he would stop there to dine.

So she said to her husband: "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us, he can stay there." Sometime later, Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.

Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her?" His servant Gehazi answered: "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years." Elisha said, "Call her." When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."

For you are the glory of their strength. In your favor, our horn will be exalted. For our shield belongs to Yahweh; our king to the Holy One of Israel.



If we died with Christ Jesus, we believe we will live together with him. We know that, since Christ Jesus rose from the dead, he cannot die again. Death no longer has power over him.



When Christ Jesus died, he died to sin forever. Now that he lives, he lives for God. Like Christ Jesus, you should consider yourselves dead to sin, but alive for God in Christ Jesus!
