(Independent Catholicism has existed in Europe and South America for many decades).

We are:

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

A Reading from the Book of Isaiah. (Isaiah 43:16-21 (USCCB))

Lector: A reading from the Book of Isaiah.

Thus says Yahweh, who made a road in the sea and a path in the mighty waters; who led a might army of chariots and horsemen to their doom; a might army, never to rise again, snuffed out and extinguished like a wick.

Remember not the events of the past; ignore the things of long ago! Look, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth - can you not see it? I am making a road in the desert and setting rivers to flow into the wasteland.

Wild beasts honor me - the jackals and the ostriches; I will put water in the desert and rivers into the wasteland for my chosen people to drink. These people whom I formed for myself, so that they might declare my praise.

Responsorial Reading (Spoken) (Psalm 78 (CCL))

Lector: Return to the Beloved.


People Respond: Return to the Beloved.

Second Reading

A Reading from a Saint Paul's Letter to the Philippians. (Philippians 3:8-14 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Philippians.

I consider everything as loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus. I have accepted the loss of all things. I consider them rubbish that I may gain the Christ and be found in Christ. I have no righteousness of my own based on the law. The only righteousness I have is from God. It comes through, and is dependent on, faith in Christ. I long to know the Christ and share in Jesus' sufferings.

I long to know the power of the resurrection. I long to become like Jesus in his death so that, somehow, I too may attain the resurrection from the dead. It is not that I have already taken hold of it or have already attained full maturity. I continue my pursuit in hope that I may complete it, since I have indeed been taken hold of by Christ Jesus.

Beloved, again, I do not consider myself to have reached oneness with Christ. I focus on just one thing: forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead. I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

They said this to test him so that they might have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger.

a stone at her."


Once again, he bent down and wrote on the ground; but, at his words, and, one by one, starting with the oldest among them, they all went away, until the last one had gone.
