(Independent Catholicism has existed in Europe and South America for many decades).

# Liturgy of the Word

First Reading
A Reading from the Book of Sirach.
(Sirach 35:12,14-15, 22 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Book of Sirach.

Give to God as God has given to you, generously and according to your means. But offer no bribes! These, God does not accept.

Our God is a God of divine justice, a Judge who doesn't play favorites. God never shows partiality at the expense of those who are poor. Rather, God hears the prayer of those who are exploited.

God will never ignore the pleas of children who have no home, or the bereft when they pour out their hearts. See how the tears that stream down their cheeks cry out against the one who causes them to fall!

But you who wholeheartedly give yourselves to God will be welcomed. Your prayer will reach the heavens and be carried upon the clouds. Indeed, the prayer of the humble heart pierces the clouds:

Until it is heard, it will not rest. It will no desist until God responds, granting justice to the righteous, and judging justly and mercifully. But alas for those who are unmerciful!

People Respond: God hears us when we call to Him.


Lector: God is near to the brokenhearted. God helps those whose spirit is crushed. The eyes of God are on those who seek justice. God's ears are attentive to their cry.

A Reading from the Second Letter of Timothy.

(2 Timothy 4:6-19, 21-22 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Second Letter of Timothy.

As for me, I am already being poured out like a wine offering, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have fought the good fight. I have finished the race. I have kept the faith. Now there is waiting a crown for righteousness, which God, the just judge, will give me on that day; and not only to me but to all love the Christ and long for the Christ's return.

Do your best to come to me quickly. Demas, in love with this present world, has deserted me and gone to Thessalonica. Crescens has gone to Galatia and Titus to Dalmatia. Only Luke is with me. Bring Mark with you, for he is of excellent use in my ministry. I have sent Tychicus to Ephesus.

When you come, bring the cloak that I

left with Carpus at Troas, also the books, and above all the parchments. Alexander the coppersmith did me great harm. God will hold him accountable. You, too, must be on your guard, for he strongly opposed our words.

At my first defense, no one came to my support. All deserted me. May it not be counted against them! God stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. I was rescued from the lion's mouth. God will rescue me from all evil and preserve my heart for the cosmic kin-dom. To God be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke. (Luke 18:9-14, 18-24 (CCL))

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ

be with you all.

People Respond: And also, with you.

Celebrant: A reading from the Good News attributed to Luke.

People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

To some who trusted in their own righteousness and looked down on others, Jesus told this parable: "Two people went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing alone, was praying like this: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week. I give a tenth of all my earnings.'

But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but while breast-beating said: 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this one went back home justified before God, rather than the other. For all who raise themselves up will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be raised up."

Later, an official asked Jesus this question, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not commit adultery; you shall not kill; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall honor your father and your mother."

The official replied, "All of these I

have observed from my youth." When Jesus heard this he said, "There is still one thing left for you. Sell all that you have and distribute it to the poor, and you will have a treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

When the official heard this he became very sad, for he was very rich. When Jesus saw that the official was filled with sorrow, Jesus was also sad and said, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God."
