Liturgy of the Word

First Reading A Reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. (Acts 14:21-27 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Book of Acts.

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to the city of Derbe and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra, Iconium, and Antioch.

In each place, they strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying: "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the reign of God."


They appointed presbyters for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to God in whom they had put their faith. Then, they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia.

After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed back to Antioch where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished.

When they arrived, they called the church together and related all that God had done through them, and how God had opened a door of faith for the Gentiles. Paul and Barnabas stayed there with the disciples for some time.

People Respond: My house shall be a house of prayer for all.



Then I saw new heavens and a new earth. The first heavens, and the first earth, had passed away. The sea was no more. I saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, coming down out of the skies, adorned as for a wedding day.

I heard a loud voice calling: "See, God will make a home among the human race. God will dwell among them. They shall be God's people. God will be with them, always, Immanuel! God will wipe away every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more. Mourning and sadness and pain will be no more. The old order is past and gone."

Then the Holy One said: "See, I am making all things new. Write this down, for these words are sure and true: It is accomplished! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty, I will give a gift from the spring of life-giving water."

Gospel

A Reading from the Gospel according to John. (John 21:1-14 (CCL))

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ be with you all.

People Respond: And also, with you.

Celebrant: A reading from the Gospel attributed to John.

People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

The risen Christ appeared to the disciples, this time at the Sea of Tiberias (also known as the Sea of Galilee). He was revealed in this way: Simon Peter, Thomas (called "the twin"), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the brothers Zebedee, and two other disciples were together.

Simon Peter announced, "I am going fishing." The rest of them replied, "We are going with you." They went out and got in the boat but caught nothing at all that night.

When the sun came up, Jesus was standing on the beach, but they didn't recognize him. Jesus spoke to them: "Good Morning! Did you catch anything for breakfast?"
They answered, "No."

He said: "Throw the net off the right side of the boat and see what happens." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish.

Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It's Jesus!" When Simon Peter realized that it was the Teacher, he threw on some clothes, for he was stripped for work, and then dived into the sea.

The other disciples came in by boat for they weren't far from land, a hundred yards or so, pulling along the net full of fish. When they got out of the boat, they saw a fire laid, with fish and bread already cooking on it. Jesus said: "Bring some of the fish you've just caught."

Simon Peter joined them and pulled their net to shore - 153 big fish! And even with all those fish, the net didn't tear. Jesus said, "Come and eat. Breakfast is ready." Not one of the disciples dared ask, "Who are you?" They knew who it was.

Jesus then took the bread and gave it to them. He did the same with the fish. This was now the thirdtime Jesus revealed himself to the disciples after being raised from the dead.

Celebrant: The Gospel of Jesus the Christ.

People Respond: Praise to you, Jesus the Christ.
