Saint Martin of Tours Inclusive Catholic Community is the first independent Catholic faith community in Franklin County, Vermont. St. Martin's is part of a vibrant movement known as the Independent Sacramental Movement that has emerged across the U.S. over the last 30 years. A Reading from the Book of Job.
(Job 5:9-11, 16, 18, 27 (CCL))

God performs wonders that cannot be fathomed, things marvelous that cannot be counted.

A Reading from Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. (1 Corinthians 9:1-6 (USCCB))

Am I, Paul, not free? Am I not an apostle? Have I not seen Jesus the Christ? Are you not my work in the Christ?

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew

with James and John. Simon's motherin-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told Jesus about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she served them.

When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to Jesus all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. Jesus cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him.

Rising very early, before dawn, Jesus left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with Jesus pursued Him, and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." Jesus told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come."

So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons, throughout the whole of Galilee.
