We are:


- a sacramental community centered around the Eucharist and all Sacraments

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading
A Reading from the Book of Wisdom.
(Wisdom 9:9-18 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Book of Wisdom.

Wisdom is with You, O God. She knows Your works. She was present when You made the Universe; You made the Universe with Her. Wisdom understands what is pleasing in Your sight and what is good and right.

Send Her forth from the holy heavens! From the dwelling place of Your glory, send Her to labor at my side that I may learn what is pleasing to You. For Wisdom knows and understands all things. She will guide me wisely in my actions and guard me with Her glory.

Then my works will be acceptable. Then I shall rule Your people justly, with equity. Then I shall be worthy of You, O God. For what human being can know the mind of God? Who can discern the desires of the Holy One?

The deliberations of the human mind are frail. Our plans uncertain, our designs often fail. A perishable body has limits. The earthly tent weighs down the mind with its many concerns. Scarcely we discern the mysteries of Earth, and it is our home! Even what is within our grasp, we ascertain with difficulty.

Who, then, has traced out what is in and beyond the heavens? Or who can know Your counsel unless You give them Wisdom and send Your Holy Spirit? Thus, the paths of those on Earth will be made holy: Wisdom will teach us what pleases You, and all will be saved by Wisdom.

A Reading from the Letter of James.
(James 1:2-5,9-12 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Letter of James.

My beloved, Whenever you face trials of any kind because of your faith, consider it nothing but joy, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance; and let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking in nothing.

But if any of you is lacking in wisdom, ask God, who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and wisdom will be given to you. Let the believer in lowly circumstances take pride in their high standing; and the rich in their lowliness, because wealth will disappear like a flower in the field. For the sun rises with its scorching heat and withers the field; its flower droops, and its beauty vanishes.

In the same way, a person will wither

Turning to them, he said: "If anyone comes to me and is not prepared to lose father and mother, spouse and children, siblings - yes, even one's own life - this person cannot be my disciple. Those who do not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciples.

Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Will you not first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? If you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will jeer at you, saying, 'There goes the one who began to build and was not able to finish.'

Or suppose a ruler is about to go to war against another ruler. Will the ruler not first sit down and consider whether it is possible, with an army of 10,000 to oppose the enemy coming against them with 20,000? If it is not possible, the ruler will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. In the same way, none of you can be my disciple if you do not let go of all that you have."

Celebrant: The Gospel of Jesus the Christ.
